

How to serve someone:


Complaint: by process server or certified mail, restricted delivery, return receipt requested.

See form CIV-106 for detailed instructions.

Everything else during a case: 1st class mail if mailed, or you can hand deliver.

<u>1 year or more after case closed:</u> *Notice of Motion* must be filed according to <u>Civil Rule</u> 5(g) service to start *Motion* practice again.

RELIEF DURING THE CASE - MOR



How to count time:

Civil Rule 6(a):

- -don't count first day
- -do count last day
- -count SA, SU, Holiday if NOT last day
- -if <7 days, don't count SA, SU, Holiday

Some of things a party might ask court for during the case:

- Interim Orders for things like custody, possession to home or vehicles etc.
- Emergency/expedited relief/orders
- Mediation of custody or support issues
- Attorney Fees from the other party
- Settlement Conference with Judge
- Custody Investigation
- Guardian ad Litem

Types of things a party does preparing for trial:

- Discovery / Civil Rule 26.1 disclosures
- Subpoenas see form CIV-109 for instructions
- Witness lists
- Exhibit lists
- Trial brief
